ABOUT THE COLLEGE

NMSM Government College, Kalpetta, established in 1981, is a pivotal educational institution located in Wayanad, Kerala. The college is set against a scenic backdrop in the rural area of Vellaramkunnu, 4 kilometers from Kalpetta, and serves as a beacon of hope for the local tribal and economically disadvantaged communities. With its 11-hectare campus donated by Sri Neelikandy Moideen Sahib, the college plays a critical role in providing accessible education to students from marginalized sections, including a large proportion of tribal students. More than 75% of the students belong to socially and economically weaker backgrounds, and about 70% are girls, making the institution a key driver of women's education in the region. The college offers a wide

range of undergraduate and postgraduate programs and is committed to providing quality education, fostering inclusive practices, and supporting differently-abled students.

NMSM Government College strives to fulfill the academic aspirations of its community by offering a supportive and inclusive learning environment. With modern infrastructure, digital classrooms, and initiatives like scholarships, financial aid, and hostel facilities, the college ensures that education is accessible to all, regardless of financial constraints. It emphasizes skill development, research, and community engagement, promoting social responsibility and environmental sustainability among its students. By focusing on the empowerment of tribal and rural students, the college remains a transformative force in Wayanad, contributing to the region's socio-economic development and bridging the educational gap for disadvantaged populations.


GOALS
